

# Hazard Management Foundations for ECITB Contractors

Course duration - 2 days

In conjunction with the Engineering Construction Industry Training Board (ECITB), employers can access funding towards this course

## About the Course

A two-day training course covering the identification, evaluation and prevention of accidents and incidents, as a direct result of failures in equipment, processes and procedures.

All employees working in high hazard industries need to understand the safety, health and environmental hazards associated with their working environment.

The Hazard Management Foundations course provides the fundamental knowledge and understanding of the principles of hazard management across the entire organisation.

## Who Should Attend?

The course is designed for managers, supervisors, designers, safety personnel, and senior contract employees working within engineering, construction and supply chain.

It is suitable for young engineers and anyone who would like to develop a more detailed understanding of process safety management.

## How is it delivered?

The two days of training can be delivered on-site to groups of up to 12 delegates. For individuals or smaller groups we run open courses across the UK. Following the course all delegates are registered for an online assessment designed to reinforce their knowledge and understanding of process safety management and demonstrate their competence in the subject. Cogent certificates, recognised by the PSMCPB, will be awarded to all who pass.

The course is delivered by highly experienced Cogent assured trainers. A combination of presentations, case studies and group discussions are used to illustrate interpretations of hazard management requirements and demonstrate ways to develop and monitor an effective hazard management programme.

### ECITB Training Support Grant

The ECITB works to ensure the engineering, construction, and supply chain workforce has the specialist skills required by industry.

## What will I learn?

On completing the course participants will understand how to:

- The benefits and key principles of hazard / process safety management
- How to identify hazards and assess the risks associated with hazardous substances and plant
- The need for effective measures to limit the consequences of a major accident and costly shutdowns
- The importance of identifying suitable safety critical equipment, implementing key risk control systems and the importance of sustaining their effectiveness
- How to apply learning from near misses
- How to monitor performance to achieve continual improvement in process safety performance

## How much does it cost?

You can access £150 per delegate per day towards a place on an open HMF course, or towards an in-house course with the ECITB funding support grant.

### Open course

£600 + VAT per delegate  
Less £600 ECITB Grant = £600 per delegate

### In-house course

£6000 +VAT for up to 10 delegates  
Additional delegates £600 per delegate  
Each delegate gets £600 ECITB grant per delegate
